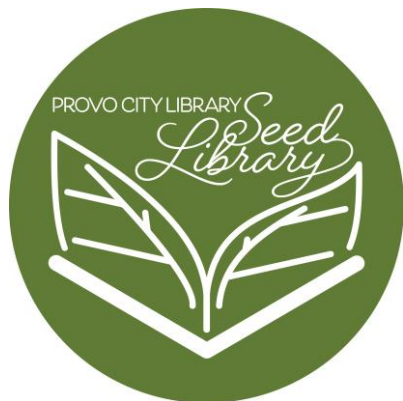


Using the Seed Library

What is a Seed Library?

A seed library is a collection of seeds you can borrow to plant & grow –
And when they seed, you can return them to the library!
This ensures that seeds will be available to all who visit the library.



Why is Seed Saving Important?

Seed saving creates more local gardeners who will save money & cultivate stronger crops – not to mention cultivates a culture of community and sharing.
Other fun reasons for having a seed library include:

- Seed Libraries function as vehicles for seed and food sovereignty
- Seed libraries promote gardening and access to healthy foods.
- Seed libraries connect patrons with their community's agrarian roots
- Everyone can contribute harvested seed to the seed library and thereby, regardless of income level, be an equal player in promoting community food security

How Do I “Checkout” Seeds?

Select the seeds you'd like from our seed library. It's that simple!
*No library card required, please limit to 3 seed packets per family.

How Do I Return Seeds?

Bring your seeds to the library, place them in an envelope, fill out the required information on the envelope, and place it in the donation box.
